## Activity 1

We're going to brainstorm some ways we can show God's love to the people around us!

- 2. Above the first heart, write "to my family". Above the second heart, write "to my friends". For the third heart, write "to my community".
- 3. Inside of each heart, write some ways you could show God's love to that group of people. If you need some help coming up with ideas, take a look at Katie's!
- 4. Decorate your page if you'd like, and you're done!



## Activity 2

Let's make a chain of paper hearts! This craft makes for an awesome decoration for your room, but it also serves as a daily reminder of how much our God loves us. <u>Here</u> is a video tutorial Katie made, but if paper instructions are better for you, here they are!

## You will need:

- A few sheets of coloured paper (or you can use white paper and colour it yourself!)
- Scissors
- Tape

## Instructions:

- 1. Fold a sheet of paper in half, and draw the shape of half of a heart, so that the middle of the heart lines up with the folded edge.
- 2. Draw the same shape, but smaller, inside of the first one.
- 3. Cut along both lines, and unfold to reveal a heart-shaped ring!
- 4. Repeat steps 1-3 to get a second heart.
- 5. Cut through the bottom of one of the hearts.
- 6. Use that slit to loop one heart through the other, so they are connected.
- 7. Repeat the process as much as you'd like, until your chain of hearts is as long as you want it to be!
